

¹ Lord, you have been our dwelling place^[a] in all generations. ² Pefere the mountains were brought forth

² Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God.

³ You turn us^[b] back to dust, and say, "Turn back, you mortals."

⁴ For a thousand years in your sight are like yesterday when it is past, or like a watch in the night.

⁶ in the morning it flourishes and is renewed; in the evening it fades and withers.
