

The clerk wears many hats, and they are all extremely important. The clerk not only handles the minutes, but also helps put together the agenda for session meetings, and by extension helps set the agenda for the congregation. If you have good organizational skills, basic computer skills, and want to serve the Lord, this is a great way to do it. Contact Clerk Fred Whitley or I with any questions.

What does a Ruling Elder do? I'm glad you asked. Our *Book of Order* tells us that, "Ruling elders, together with ministers of the Word and Sacrament, exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline, and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation as well as the whole church, including ecumenical relationships" (G-2.0301). As a Ruling Elder, you are a leader in the church, you attend monthly Session meetings, serve on a committee, such as Worship and Music, or Personnel, or Finance, sometimes you are the chairperson of a committee, and you are also eligible to serve communion, and have responsibility for opening and closing the church on Sundays. The congregation chooses Ruling Elders, so it is an elected position. Please contact Judy Pike, or George Wheat or me if you feel called to be a Ruling Elder or Clerk of Session.

I'll be in Wisconsin and Illinois visiting family and friends and celebrating my father's 90<sup>th</sup> birthday from May 3-11, 2024. I am praying for it to be warm while I'm there. 



#### **Treasurer's Update** By Gene Raymond Faith Treasurer

**WE HAVE A CHANGE TO OUR BUDGET.** On April 16<sup>th</sup>, the Session voted to increase Faith's 2024 Operating Budget to \$366,532, an increase of \$48,000. This increase was added to account for the purchase and installation of our new Air Conditioning system. This increase reflects the new financial requirements we will be operating under for the rest of the year and will allow the Session and the congregation to better track our financial status. The chart below shows the new budget line and the first quarter income and expenses. The expense line includes the first half of the Air Conditional payment. The other half will be paid in April. In spite of the larger than normal payment in March, thanks to your generosity, we still took in more than we spent in the first quarter. Last year we ended up within 1 per cent of our income verses expenses, hopefully everyone will continue to be as generous in their support of Faith's Ministries for this of this year as you were for last year.
