

SERMON "The Prophet's Uncomfortable Truth" Rev. Brian Louis

OUR RESPONSE TO GOD'S WORD—adaptation of "A Brief Statement of Faith" In life and in death we belong to God. Give Me Your Tired, Your Poor

In 1876 France announced it was giving the United States a statue commemorating the American centennial. A few years later the enormous sculpture was delivered, and a few years after that the famous American journalist and philanthropist Joseph Pulitzer organized a subscription to raise money for a base to support the statue. This endeavor provided Irving Berlin with the plot for his 1949 musical hit, Miss Liberty (with the book by Robert E. Sherwood). In a sense the base inspired the final stirring song for the show. Berlin set to music the stanza that is inscribed on the base, which is a verse from a longer poem by Emily Lazerus called "The New Colossus."
