PASTOR'S POST



Dear Members and Friends of Faith,

First, I want to encourage you all to read Treasurer Gene Raymond's article for this month's newsletter. You won't want to miss it.

This week our denomination's General Assembly is underway in Salt Lake City. The General Assembly is where the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) decides all kinds of matters related to our denomination. The General Assembly is where changes to our church constitution take place and changes to procedures to the ordination process for ministers occur as well. The denomination also takes positions on social issues in our denomination, world, and nation from time to time. Sometimes that causes hard feelings and outrage. I don't agree with everything the denomination does and I don't agree with everything our denomination emphasizes at times. But by and large, I do. No denomination is perfect, but ours is as perfect as I have found. That's why I joined it.

I was not born into the Presbyterian Church. And after being away from church for thirty years as an adult, this is the denomination I decided to call home. Fourth Presbyterian Church in Chicago was the first church I joined as a member. Why? Because at the time it had a dynamic preacher who happened to be a woman (not every Christian church allows that, of course). It was a safe place for me to talk to the ministers there about the questions I had about Christianity and the church. It was safe for me to express my skepticism and reserve over religion. I could ask questions and not be told what to believe or which political ideology to hold. I liked that the PCUSA took seriously the message of Jesus in Matthew Chapter 25 to feed the hungry, to give drink to the thirsty, to clothe the naked, to visit those in prison, and to welcome the stranger. I loved that the church did its best to live the message of the gospel of Jesus the Christ and to do as Christ commanded, to love one another.

I loved that the denomination had a General Assembly, and that we made decisions together after much deliberation. Presbyterian (derived from the Greek word *presbyteros*, meaning elder) refers to our form of church government, another part of the church I love. I love the way we are governed, even though at times it is frustrating to do things "decently and in order."

I could have joined any other Christian denomination, but this was the closest I could come to finding the perfect place for me, my theology, and my views on the world. I pray that the commissioners to the General Assembly make good decisions this year.

Meanwhile, we at Faith, through your Session, will have some important decisions to make this year about the future of the church. Stay tuned!


